In this connection we may mention that the unveiling ceremony of the portrait of late Ananga Mohan, presented by his brothers, took place on the 3rd April in the Library Hall. The staff and the students assembled first in Room No 1. Prof. Nripendra Chandra Banerjee who presided over the ceremony, spoke pathetically dwelling on the activities of Anangamohan. Sm. Basanta Kumar Bagchi of the 3rd Year B. A. also said a few words about him. The vast gathering then shifted to the Library Hall in a solemn procession, where Prof. Banerjee unveiled the portrait of the deceased.

It is with a sense of profound sorrow that we have to record the death of two more of our college students—Sreemans Devendra Nath Pal of 3rd yr. B. A. and Sarat Chandra Sarkar, a candidate for the I. Sc. Examination

from our college. The latter was a boarder of the College Hostel and died of Typhoid fever.
