

JATINDRA NATH DAS.

The inevitable has happened at last. News has just reached us that Sriman Jatindraanth Das who went on hunger strike in the Lahore Jail, is no more. Jatindranath was a student of the 4th Year Arts class of this college and by his excellent character easily won the love of his teachers and fellow-students alike. The students of our college so loved and respected him that they made him one of the Vice-Presidents of the College Students' Association. During the last Summer Vacation Jatindranath was arrested in connection with what is known as the Lahore Conspiracy Case. What his offence was we do not know and shall never know. He is now beyond the reach of all earthly tribunals. Along with other political prisoners in Lahore Jatindranath commenced hunger-strike in July last as a protest against the inhuman treatment meted out to under-trial political prisoners in this country and after 63 days of hunger-strike left this mortal world on Friday, the 13th September last. His supreme self-sacrifice finds a parallel in the noble sacrifice of MacSwiney in Ireland. His was a resolute will and an indomitable courage and all patriotic Indians must honour him and deplore his loss. Our hearts are simply overwhelmed with grief, and tears forbid us to write more about him. Noble soul crushed in the prime of your life ! May the cause for which you sacrificed yourself triumph, and may you rest in peace !

As a mark of respect for the memory of Jatindranath Das the College remained closed on Monday the 16th September. On the following day the staff and the students assembled in the College court-yard at 3-30 P. M. and passed a condolence resolution. A memorial committee has also been formed and attempts are being made to raise funds for a suitable memorial of this renowned martyr. We hope the

memory of Jatindranath will be enshrined in the hearts of all the students of this College. We also offer our heart-felt condolence to Jatin's old father, S^r. Bankim Behari Das, who also was a student of this College.

THE RESULTS,

The results of the I. Sc. Examination were published in the *Calcutta Gazette* of the 30th May. 854 have passed in the First Division (as against 1008 of last year), 834 in the Second Division (as against 858 last year), and 158 in the Third Division (which is higher than the last year's figure by 23). The total number of passes at the I. Sc. thus comes up to 1846 which is lower than the last year's output by 155. This shows a steady decline in the number of passes at the I. Sc. Examination.

At the I. Sc. Examination our College has passed 317, a figure slightly lower than the last year's total of 327. This is the **largest number passed by any college**, just as it has been the case in the last **thirteen** years. Of this total 132 have passed in the First Division, 146 in the Second Division, and 37 in the Third Division. Of the first ten places as many as three have been occupied by our boys. We congratulate Sreemans Tapendra Kumar Pal, Susil Kumar Basu, and Kshitish Chandra Basu on their having secured the 3rd, 5th and 6th places respectively, in order of merit.
