## INTERMEDIATE EXAMINATION IN SCIENCE FOR 1909 AND SUBSEQUENT YEARS.

COMPULSORY.

I & II as in the Arts Examination.

III. Chemistry: Two papers.

IV. Mathematics or Physics: Two papers in each.

V. Any one of several science subjects including Mathematics or Physics if not taken up as the 4th subject. Two papers in each.

## OPTIONAL.

In addition to these a candidate may take up another Science subject or French or German: Two Papers in each, (This is optional.)

Each paper carries 100 marks.

minimum for a pass, the same as in the Arts Examination except that in the additional subject, if taken up, marks in excess of 60 (i. e. 30°/o) shall be counted towards the total. At the same time no pass is insisted on in the optional subject.

Candidates may pass on from the Arts to the Science side or vice versa at the Intermediate Examination by attending lectures for one year after passing either, they being exempted from appearing and attendance in such subjects in which they have already passed. They must obtain 36% in each of the new subjects. [No such proviso applies to the Degree Examination—Editor.]
