## CO-OPERATIVE STORES.

Bangabasi College Co-operative Stores Limited was registered under the Co-operative Society's Act in July 1918 and its practical operations commenced soon after. Within a short time, more than three hundred shares of Rs. 5 each were subscribed by the Students and Professors of the College, although the venture was quite a new one and not in accordance with the ordinary academic wa, of thinking common amongst students and teachers alike. The movement, however, received an unexpected check from November till the re-opening of the College in July. The College was practically in a state of hibernation during these months due to the absence of students for influenza-epidemic, the University Examinations and long vacations. In spite of these deterrent causes, the Stores have made a very fair progress. So far as the business part of it is corporated, it is expected to have earned about 25% profit on its outlast of capital. The profit and loss account and the Balance

sheet are not published in this number of the Mugazine as the Accounts a e being audited by the officers of the Govt. Co-operative. Society. The Secretary, Joint Secretaries, Store-keeper, Salesmen &c. who are all students and teachers of the College and doing / the spade-work for this Pioneer Institution by putting their shoulders voluntarily to the wheel are to be warmly congratulated for what they have done. But a great deal yet remains to be done and if the past, however short, be any guide for the future, it is hoped that the students in whom and for whom the Institution lives will in a body come to its support and make the venture a success. The great future of this Co-operative movement in the College lies however not on its business or profit-and-loss side only, but mainly on its social and communal side. The student-workers imbibing from it the principles and practical applications of Co-operation will on their return to their village home be the centre of Co-operative propaganda on which alone lies the industrial salvation of the country. It is however yet premature to deal with this aspect of the College Co-operative Stores.
