## THE COLLEGE UNION.

It may be in the recollection of our readers that the metabers of the staff were 'At Home' on Sunday the 23rd February to meet their colleague, Professor Panchanan Mitra M. A., P. R. S. (A full account of this pleasant function appeared in our February issue). It was suggested on this happy occasion by Professor Ladlimohan Mitra and several other members of the staff that a College Union in which the members of the staff might come together and mix freely with one another was a desideratum. It was accordingly settled by the members present that such a Union including not only the Professors and Demonstrators but also the Laboratory Assistants, the Librarian and the office staff should be started at once and that it should meet once a month except during vacation months. A small subscription was to be paid by all the members for each month in which the Union was to be held, in order to defray the incidental expenses of tea and light (?) refreshments. Professors Ladlimohan Mitra and Panchanan Mitra were unanimously appointed Honorary Secretaries of the Union and the whole scheme received the sympathy and support of our esteemed Principal on the spot.

Accordingly, the preliminaries having been gone through, the Graien was inaugurated on Sunday the 23rd March, on which date it held its sitting from 6 P. M. to 9 P. M. The Proceedings commenced with a patriotic song sung by Sj. Krishnakumar Bhattacharyya to the accompaniment of instrumental music executed by Sj. Nirendrakumar Basu (both these gentlemen were kind enough to grace the Union with their presence, to which the organisers offer them their best thanks). This is inclowed by a neat, little speech from the Principal explining the object of the Union and expressing his warm approval of the idea.
