

The College School sent up fifty seven candidates for the last Matriculation examination. Of these, forty-one came out successful; twenty being placed in the first division, twenty in the second division and one in the third division. The percentage of success was 71.93, (much higher than the University percentage). One secured a junior scholarship of fifteen rupees a month, against two of Rs 10/- each last year.

The school lost by death on the 4 of June last one of its veteran teachers, Babu Narendra Nath Majumdar, who had been on the teaching staff since 1909 and had served the school with considerable credit. Many of his students are now fathers of families and still cherish his memory with loving respect. An oil painting of his has been prepared by his colleagues and pupils, and will be unveiled and placed in the school just before the Puja Vacation.

The school has also lost, in the late Prof. K. D. Mullick, one of its best workers on the school Managing Committee. Indeed, Prof. Mullick has left behind him an undying fame as a sincere and indefatigable worker in the interest of the school.
