memory of Jatindranath will be enshrined in the hearts of all the students of this College. We also offer our heart-felt condolence to Jatin's old father, Sj. Bankim Behari Das, who also was a student of this College.

THE RESULTS,

The results of the I. Sc. Examination were published in the Calcutta Gazette of the 30th May. 854 have passed in the First Division (as against 1008 of last year), 834 is the Second Division (as against 858 last year), and 153 in the Third Division (which is higher than the last year's figure by 23), The total number of passes at the I. Sc. thus comes up to 1846 which is lower than the last year's output by 155. This shows a steady decline in the number of passes at the I. Sc. Examination.

At the I. Sc. Examination our College has passed 317, a figure slightly lower than the last year's total of 327. This is the argest number passed by any college, just as it has been the case in the last thirteen years. Of this total 132 have passed in the First Division, 148 in the Second Division, and 37 in the Third Division. Of the first ten places as many as three have been occupied by our boys. We congratulate Sreemans Tapendra Kumar Pal, Susil Kumar Basu, and Kshitish Chandra Basu on their having secured the 3rd, 5th and 6th places respectively, in order of merit. Other successful candidates from our college who deserve special mention are Sinha Kalika Nandan (12th), Chakravarti Adinath (13th), Chakravarte Sudhansu Kumar (14th), Basu Pulin Behari (17th), Roy Jasodakanta 19th), Chakravarti Kalipada (22nd), Chattopadhyaya Bhujangabhusan (23rd**)**, Bandopadhyaya (32nd), Susilkumar Bhattacharya

Bibhuti Bhushan (34th), Sinha Gosthabehari (37th), Nandi Biswanath (45th), and Mazumdar Jyotiprosad & Saha Aswini Kumar (50th).

Our last year's prophecy has come true. As many as seven of our students shine in the list of Senior Government scholar-ship-holders of this year. Sriman Tapendrakumar Pal who stood first in the University minus the marks of the additional subject, stands first in the list of the senior scholarship-holders of Assam. As he is a domiciled Assamese, his name does not appear in the Bengal list of senior scholars. Srimans Kshitish Chandra Basu and Jasoda Kanta Roy of our college have also secured first grade senior scholarships; while Srimans Sushil Kumar Basu, Bhujangabhushan Chattopadhyaya, Sudhansu-Kumar Chakravarti and Kalikananda Sinha have been a warded second grade senior scholarships. We congratulate these students as well as ourselves on their having secured senior scholarships and hope their successors will break all records in the coming year.

The results of the I. A. Examination were published in the Calcutta Gazette along with the I. Sc. results, 601 have passed in the First Division (as against 697 of last year), 837 in the Second Division (which is much lower than the last year's figure of 923), and 218 in the Third Division (which is also lower than the last year's figure by 41). This brings the total to 1656 which falls short of the last year's output by 223. There is thus a rapid decline of the passes at the I. A. Examination.

At the I. A. Examination our College has passed 22 (which is lower than the last year's total by 2). Of these 7 have been placed in the First Division, 10 in the Second Division, and 5 in the Third Division. We congratulate Sriman Bhutnath Chandra of our college on his having secured the 11th place in order of merit. We are however sorry to note that he has narrowly missed a senior Government scholarship.

The total number of our passes at the I.A. Examination looks very poor indeed when contrasted with the total number of our passes at the I. Sc., but this is due to the fact that we have only one Section on the Arts side, and this even is not half-full.

The results of the B. Sc. Examination were published in the Calcutta Gazette of the 11th July. 114 have obtained honours (as against 103 of the previous year), 134 have passed with Distinction (as against 109 of last year), and 404 have passed in the Pass Course. This brings the total to 652 which is higher than the last year's total by 63.

At the B. Sc. Examination our college has passed 36 (which is higher than the last year's figure by 6). Of these 3 have passed with Distinction, and the rest in the Pass Course.

The results of the B. A. Examination were published in the Calcutta Gazette of the 18th July.

301 have obtained Honours (as against 266 of the previous year), 104 have passed with Distinction (as against 126 of the previous year,) and 1420 have passed in the Pass Course (as

against 1123 of the previous year). The total thus comes up to 1825 which is much higher than the last year's output of 1515. It is a pleasure to see that there is a steady rise in the number of our graduates every year.

At the B. A. Examination our college has passed 48 which is higher than the last year's figure by 3. Of these 3 have obtained Honours (English, Sanskrit and Mathematics each claim: ing one student), 3 have passed with Distinction, and 42 in the Pass Course. We congratulate Srimans Prafulla Kumar Bag, Krishnadhan Bhattacharyya and Surendranath Mukhopadhyaya on their having obtained Honours in English, Sanskrit and Mathematics respectively.

We have much pleasure to announce that the Hara Kumar Tagore Sanskrit Graduate Prize of books of the value of Rs. 90 for the year 1928 has been awarded to Sriman Pulin Behari Pal of our college who secured the highest marks in Sanskrit among the successful candidates at the B. A. Examination in 1928 but failed to secure any scholarship.

The results of the Matriculation Examination were published in the Calcutta Gazette of the 20th June. As it has become the established practice in recent eyears to print the names of successful candidates under the names of the schools from which they appear, it is impossible for us to give our readers a correct idea of the total number passed this year. If what appeared in the Dailies is correct, it is to be believed that the percentage of success is a little over 67.

The College School sent up fifty-three candidates for the last Matriculation Examination, of whom forty-six came out success ful, thirty-eight being placed in the First Division, seven in the Second Division and one in the Third Division. The percentage of success was 86 79 against 77.36 last year. Of those that came out successful, four secured "stars", and eighteen secured "letters" in various subjects. One Sriman Nalini Nath Kundu secured a third-grade scholarship; and we congratulate him on his success. May his future career be still brighter! He was also a prize-winner, on several occasions, in our School Sports and it is certainly a glad sight to see him carrying off the laurel both in physical and intellectual competitions.
