

THE COLLEGE CALENDAR.

This Institution was founded under the name of Bangabasi School in May 1886. The success of the School in the first year of its existence led the founder to add to it a College Department, which was affiliated to the F. A. Standard in June 1887 and to the B. A. and B. L. Standards in March 1896. The College also prepared students for the M. A. Examination. Under the Universities Act of 1904, affiliation in the Intermediate Standard in Arts was restricted to the subjects of English, Bengali, Sanskrit, Mathematics, History, Logic, Physics, Chemistry and Botany and in the same standard in Science restricted to the subjects of English, Bengali, Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry and Botany; and in the B. A. Standard restricted to the subjects of English (Pass and Honours), Bengali, Sanskrit (Pass and Honours), Mathematics (Pass and Honours), History (Pass), and Political Economy & Political Philosophy (Pass) and in the B. Sc. Standard in the subjects of Physics (Pass), Chemistry (Pass), Botany (Pass), and Mathematics (Pass and Honours).

The Arts Department of the College has, in addition to lecture work, provision for regular tutorial help and exercise work, conducted by the Professors in charge of the respective subjects with the help of tutors and supervised and scrutinized by Babu Lalitkumar Banerjee, the Senior Professor of English.

The Science Department consists of a lecture gallery fitted up with the modern requirements of Science-teaching, a Physics Laboratory, a Chemistry Laboratory and a Botanical Laboratory for Intermediate Students: and two Physics Laboratories, one Chemical Laboratory and two Botanical Laboratories for B. A. and B. Sc. students. Gas, water and electric connexions have been so laid out that the students working in the laboratories may have a plentiful supply of these necessary adjuncts of practical work. The laboratory rooms are lighted up with powerful electric lamps so that practical work when necessary is continued right into the early part of the night. The laboratory work is conducted by the Professors and Demonstrators and scrutinized by the Principal.

The tutorial and exercise work in the Arts subjects and practical laboratory work in the Science subjects are recorded in manuscript books of prescribed size with a printed College label attached to each. These manuscript books are carefully scrutinized, corrected and initialed by the Professors, Tutors and Demonstrators in charge.

There is a printed catalogue of books contained in the Library and each student is supplied with a copy of it at a nominal price. Besides the books prescribed and recommended by the University, the Library possesses many

other useful books of reference. To keep the Science students posted in the facts of the latest developments of the subjects of their study, the Chemical Society's Journal, the Linnæan Society's Journal, and The Journal of Physics are subscribed. In the spacious Library, tables and seats have been arranged for the boys to consult the books, the scientific Journals and other periodicals during their leisure hours. Excepting the prescribed text-books and books of reference, all other books are lent out to students, one volume at a time, to be returned after a week.

The College has been publishing since January 1903, a magazine styled the **Bangabasi College Magazine** which is issued every month excepting during vacation months. Contributions in English, Bengali and Sanskrit are received from students and ex-students of the College as well as from members of the staff. No contributions from outsiders are accepted. Educational matters and news mainly connected with the University form the contents of the news column of the Magazine. Political and controversial matters are on principle eschewed as unwholesome and beyond the range of students. It further affords an exercise-ground for the students to try their powers of composition ; above all it tends to promote an *esprit de corps* to which we attach very great importance and which is one of the most potent factors in creating and upholding a genuine **College life and College atmosphere**. In pursuance of this object, a **Sporting Club** has been organized under whose auspices the College often enters for the Elliot Shield and other prizes open to College sporting clubs. It thus enables the boys to spend their afternoons in manly open-air games wherein is developed the spirit of co-operation and healthy rivalry so essential to the growth of a sturdy manhood. Further, there exist a Literary Society and an Economics Association, the latter conducted by the B. A. students.

The monthly tuition fee is Rs. 5 for the Intermediate classes, Rs. 6 or Rs. 5 for the B. A. classes according as a Science subject is taken or not, and Rs. 6 for the B Sc. classes. Besides this, the students have to pay annual laboratory fees of Rs. 8, Rs. 4 and Rs. 4 for B. A. and B. Sc. practical courses in Chemistry, Physics and Botany respectively ; Rs. 6, Rs. 2, and Rs. 2 for Intermediate practical courses in the same subjects and in the same order ; a punkha fee of Re. 1 and a Sports and Magazine fee of Re. 1 ; *for the last fee they get the College Magazine free of charge*. Admission fee in the case of new-comers is the same as the monthly tuition fee.

Free-Studentship—Government Junior and Senior scholars receive tuition free.

Student's Fund—Besides, there is a Student's Fund organized by the uniostudents of the College. Feary help deserving students reading in his

College is given in the shape of College Fees, price of necessary books and instruments &c., out of this Fund.

At the I. A. Physics is not allowed ; at the B. A. Physics and Chemistry are not allowed. All possible combinations of the remaining subjects are allowed. *Honours in English, Sanskrit and Mathematics.*

There are a College Hostel and several College Messes close to the College.
